Ask silly questions

When you are reviewing grammar points or conversation practice, casually insert bizarre questions like: So, how many times have you been to the moon? Or: Do you prefer chocolate ice cream or fish ice cream?

Deliberately make errors or tell blatant falsehood

For example, when reviewing measurements, etc say: I'm 20 feet tall. I weigh 16 pounds

Exaggerate

Even when using a phonics based reader, you can model the reading by exaggerating the voices. Like making one character whine or another growl.
