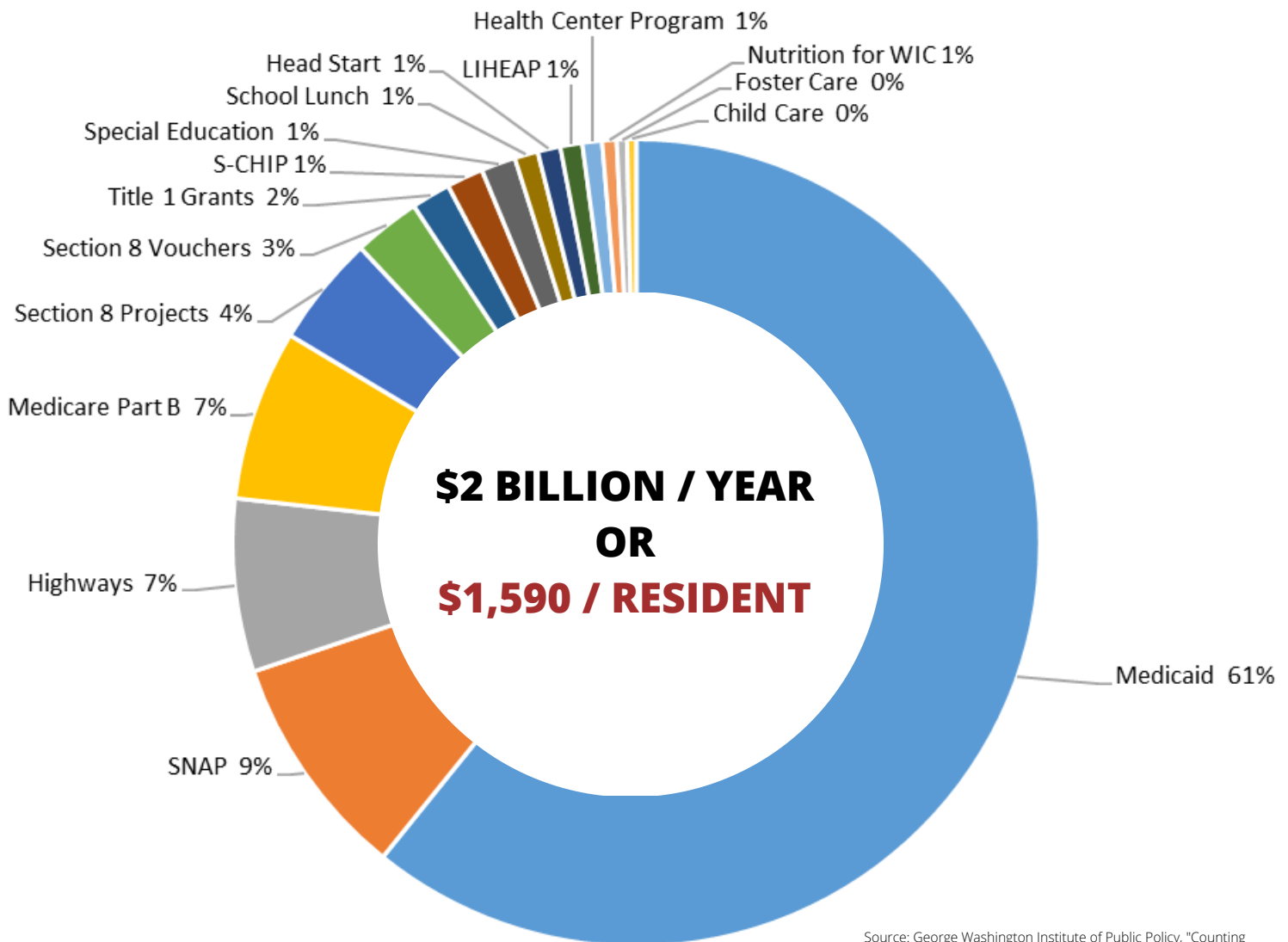


Rhode Island and the 2020 Census



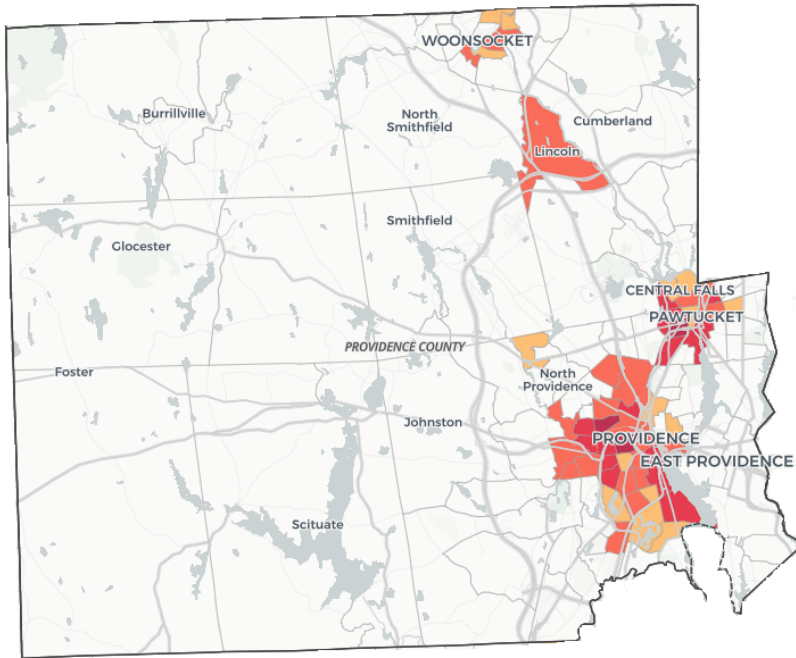
How much will an undercount cost us?
